Doctor of Medical Sciences (DMSc)

The DMSc is a fully-online 36 semester credit hour program that is designed to be completed in either 12 months (three semesters), full-time, or over an extended period part-time. The coursework is comprised of required courses, elective courses, and a capstone.

Students will be required to enroll in a total of 6 credits of the HSCI 5100-5300 Capstone as a part of the program. The capstone provides students with a comprehensive opportunity to engage in real-world problem solving within a healthcare setting. Students will identify a healthcare-related project that may involve leadership, management, regulatory, technical, educational, policy or clinical aspects, or a combination of these components.

Program completion also requires confirmation of NCCPA certification.

Academic Petitions

- Variances in cross-registration and general education requirements
- Exceptions to graduation requirements or other KGI academic policies
